PRESIDENT'S REPORT Ray Dillard

As I mentioned in my last column in Crescendo, in my articles I am going to address issues of concern to members, focussing on the concept that "the business of music continues to evolve at an unprecedented pace." My first entry in this series was in the last issue of Crescendo, and dealt with current trends in the delivery of music from artist to consumer. That column specifically looked at the basic change in selling and distributing music, in moving from physical formats (LP, 8-track, cassette, CD, etc.) to downloadable digital formats. The basic message of that column was that physical formats of all types are becoming things of the past. The new delivery method of choice is streaming!

So, what is streaming? Generally speaking, streaming is the act of listening to (or in the case of video, watching) music or other media in real time, as opposed to first downloading the media, then listening to it. As bandwidth keeps increasing in Canada, the quality available in this format continues to get better and better. In its infancy, streaming was primarily available with very low quality audio files. As available bandwidth increases, computers and smart phones get more powerful, and file buffering improves, glitch-free, high-quality audio playback becomes a real possibility. Audio streaming is actually capable of higher quality than video streaming, as the "data package" of even high-quality audio is quite a bit smaller than that of video.

As our recorded music becomes available on streaming services, the real issue of concern for us, the musicians, is that of compensation. Some of the most common streaming services are Google Play Music, Spotify, Pandora, Amazon Prime Music, Rhapsody, Bandcamp, and of course Apple Music. This is a very short list of the available services out there! These are all "legal" services, meaning that they offer some sort of compensation for the music that they stream. The unfortunate reality is that for every legal service, there are dozens of illegal

services which offer no compensation whatsoever for the artists or the publishers.

Just to give you a broad overview of sales to income relationships, check out this data from InformationIsBeautiful.net:

- \$12.00 sale of anything self-produced and self-distributed — Profit is \$12.00 to an unsigned artist
- \$10.00 download of entire album on Bandcamp — Profit is \$6.50 to an unsigned artist
- \$12.00 sale of CD or download on CDBaby — Profit is approx. \$7.45 to an unsigned
- \$0.99 sale of a single track on iTunes profit is \$0.69 to an unsigned artist
- \$0.99 sale of a single track on iTunes profit is \$0.23 to a signed artist
- \$9.99 sale of an album on iTunes profit is \$2.30 to a signed artist
- ...now for the bad news:
- a signed artist streaming receives an average of 20% of the streaming fee
- an unsigned artist streaming receives an average of 60% of the streaming fee
- ...and now for the really bad news. For signed artists:
- on Google Play, the artist receives \$0.0072/
- on Tidal, the artist receives \$0.007/ play
- on Beats, the artist receives \$0.003/ play
- on Rhapsody, the artist receives \$0.0019/
- on Deezer, the artist receives \$0.001/ play
- on Spotify, the artist receives \$0.0011/ play
- on YouTube, the artist receives \$0.0003/ play I will leave it up to you to do the math. While streaming is becoming more and more

prevalent, the income from streaming for even the highest-selling artists is remarkably low. While the media delivery industry works feverishly to figure out more ways to capitalize on streaming, the creators of that media are struggling to see any realistic profits from this new phenomenon. My next entry in this series will look at publishing — what it was and what it has become.



On behalf of the MAF Committee — made up of Director Les Allt, Executive Director Michael Murray, and me - I would like to wish each of you a happy and healthy New

For those of you who are experiencing long-term illness, however, please note that there are a few options available to help you. Issued from the TMA's Health Education and Welfare Fund, the TMA's "sick benefit" provides modest financial assistance of \$75 a week for a six-week period to TMA members in good standing. With approval from the Board of Directors, these payments may be extended for up to six weeks, for a total of up to twelve weeks. Instructions and forms are available from the TMA office at 416-421-

If your illness continues beyond twelve weeks and you have exhausted this "sick benefit," then you may be eligible to receive help from the TMA's Member Assistance Fund. To apply for this assistance, you must provide a current letter from your doctor that outlines the nature and duration of your illness, including the length of time it will continue and how it impacts your ability to work. Also include a separate, brief letter outlining your financial need and/or circumstances. Specify whether you are seeking help from the Member Assistance Fund for your annual TMA Membership Dues and/or a weekly payment of \$75 per week for up to six weeks, or up to twelve weeks in extraordinary circumstances. The two documents should be mailed to the attention of "Chair, MAF Committee" at the TMA Office, for consideration by the MAF Committee.

The TMA's Bylaws provide for the Member Assistance Fund as follows:

"A benevolent fund known as the Member Assistance Fund shall be maintained to provide modest financial assistance to members experiencing dire circumstances. (...) Financial assistance may be provided to a member upon written application for:

- Payment of periodic dues and/or
- For additional amounts determined to be appropriate to each applicant.

Except that, amounts payable to any single member shall be limited, in order to sustain the ongoing viability of the Member Assistance Fund (MAF)."




MPTF COMMITTEE Jay Boehmer

Processing MPTF paperwork at the TMA is currently running smoothly. The online application has eased the general process of applying for funds, but the system needs to be monitored regularly for applications that have been approved by the MPTF office in New York City, as well as for performances that have taken place. Contracts also need to be processed on a weekly basis, as do payments for pension, work dues, and administration

Our annual allocation will be up this year, to \$17,000, from \$14,000 in 2015/16. (The MPTF fiscal year ends April 30th.) There is a positive trend developing for Local 149, with 59 performances as of the writing of this report. The annual average over the past three years has been 54 performances. We hit a low point in 2014/15, with only 47 performances.

Educational performances through the TSO Preludes Programme have all but dried up since the Toronto Symphony Orchestra closed this department. I still get a few requests for in-school concerts. I would love to find a way to get TMA musicians back in the schools.

Many thanks to Peggy Hills and Linda Thomas of the Chamber Music Society of Mississauga. They have hired many TMA musicians for their "Out and About" concert series, as well as for performances in seniors' homes in Mississauga. I think it's great that the MPTF can help stretch their budget a little further.

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TORONTO MUSICIANS' ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEETING SUNDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2016, 11:00 a.m.

Chair of the meeting: President Ray Dillard Secretary of the meeting: Charlie Gray

The meeting was called to order by President Dillard at 11:03 a.m.

Vice President Cara then conducted the Roll Call of Officers.

Present: Dillard, Cara, Gray, Beaumont, Sander Walker.

Regrets: Allt, Morris, Mosher, Sandals, Simmonds, Spurgeon.

Dillard gave his welcoming remarks, announced that a quorum had been attained, and then proposed the following two Motions: **MOTION #1:** (Barrett/Boehmer) "that the Agenda for this TMA General Meeting of December 11, 2016, as published in the November 2016 issue of *Crescendo*, be approved." **Carried.**

MOTION #2: (Macmillan/Vangraft) "that the Draft Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of May 29, 2016, as published in the November 2016 issue of *Crescendo*, be approved." **Carried.**

President Dillard then gave his report which mentioned a revised and friendlier Tariff being currently worked on, our new financial software also currently in development, and an explanation of how information is shared at the AFM level. Secretary Gray added that the tariff make-over is the essential first step in developing on-line contracts, and other major locals were currently trying to tackle the challenge of on-line contracts as well but are no further ahead of us for the most part.

Gray then stated the rules for the Nomination and Election of Delegates to the Canadian Conference, noting that President Dillard will be a Delegate by virtue of the provision of Art. 69(1) of the by-Laws, and as required by the U.S. Department of Labor stipulations, his name must appear on the ballot for Delegates.

Gray then asked for nominations from the floor for a second delegate; Kevin Barrett nominated Michael Murray, who subsequently accepted the nomination. Gray then asked for an alternate delegate. Amelia Shiels was nominated by Michael Murray; Shiels accepted the nomination.

Michael Murray began his Executive Director's Report by describing a recent Study performed by students at Schulich School of Business which analyzed TMA's operations and made recommendations for improvement. Murray also touched upon negotiations currently in progress and others due for negotiation in 2017. Michael discussed the current list of member discounts which are currently available and gave a brief overview of Financials and Budget in the absence of Treasurer Morris.

Secretary Gray then asked ED Murray to

explain, prior to the actual reading of Motion #3, the recent process of acquiring quotes from different Auditors and the end result. Murray then fielded questions from the floor, and Gray then made the following Motion:

MOTION #4: (Gray/Vangraft) "that Hogg, Shain and Scheck Chartered Accountants, under Sam Marinucci, be appointed Auditors of the Toronto Musicians' Association and Toronto Musicians' Building Corporation for 2016, to hold office until the next Annual General Meeting of the Association, at such remuneration as may be fixed by the Board of Directors." **Carried.**

Membership & Communications Chair Linda Cara focused mainly on the upcoming Christmas get-together at Dora Keogh's on the following night.

There was no FMG or MPTF Report.

There were no recipients of cards and pins present at this meeting.

Dillard then asked for a Commemoration of recently deceased Members, followed by a moment of silence.

MOTION #4: (Vangraft) "that the meeting adjourn."
